Crook County School District Seeking Community Feedback on Superintendent Appointment

The Crook County School District School Board is seeking input from students, families, staff and community members regarding the potential appointment of Dr. Joel Hoff, currently serving as Interim Superintendent, to the role of permanent Superintendent. All interested individuals are strongly encouraged to participate as feedback is a critical component of the board's decision-making process.

The district has an anonymous survey that invites stakeholders to share their perspectives on Dr. Hoff's leadership as Interim Superintendent and to indicate whether they support his appointment to permanent Superintendent. The school board is committed to ensuring this process is transparent, open to all stakeholders and meaningful.

The survey will close on January 26, 2026. A summary of the survey results will be presented publicly at the February School Board meeting.

In addition to the survey, the School Board will host a series of listening sessions in February with staff, students, families and community members to further gather perspectives and deepen its understanding of stakeholder feedback. The process for participating in these listening sessions will be communicated mid to late January. Findings from the listening sessions will be presented to the Board at the March school board meeting.

Peter Wylia Sharp

February 23, 1943 - December 22, 2025

Pete Sharp, 82, of Prineville, OR, passed away on Dec 22, after a major injury he sustained a few days prior. Pete was born Feb 23, 1943 in Prineville to John and Patricia (Pat) Sharp. He grew up on a homestead 10 miles west of Paulina, being his dad's right hand man starting as early as 3 driving the tractor so John could feed. A couple of years later he had learned to drive the cattle truck and ride horses well. He developed a deep love for horses as well as tinkering with cars.

By the time he was 10, if he wasn't helping John with the farm work at home, he was hiring out for the neighbor. Going out for a sport in High School was not easy with work on the ranch but he did do wrestling. He didn't win all of his matches, but he was never pinned. He graduated from Crook County High School in 1961 and joined the Air Force. He had lots of stories about being in the service, the best ones were his jumping from air planes and accidentally emptying ammonia out of a tank next to an air vent that supplied air to the headquarters where all the officers worked,

causing them all to have to evacuate.

Pete started fixing up old cars and selling them as a side hobby during his military time and continued doing that or fixing heavy equipment throughout his life. Pete always loved horses and rodeo, so after his service, he worked on the ranch in Paulina and rode rough stock in several rodeos around. He was a man never wanting to sit still so he was always doing odd jobs or picking up what he could to keep busy. In 1969 he met and then married Geannie Andre and they had 2 kids Kitty (Lauman) and Ron. During this time he purchased a service station off hwy 26 and was logging in the Ochocos. His marriage didn't last long but he continued being a supporting figure in his kids' lives and was always there to help his ex-wife when she needed it.

He married again in 1980 to Linda Wattenbarger and they had 2 children, Lindy and Johnathon. He continued working in the woods as a logger, skidder, thinner, etc. and any other thing that could keep him going. In the early 90's he ran for County Judge, willing to step in and try to make a difference in Crook County. He always said you can't complain about things unless you are willing to step up and make a difference. Pete was always a man that knew no strangers and loved to talk and help others. Whether it was helping with moving, building a new road, clearing out a place for a new house, digging a ditch, pulling you out of a ditch, or just needing a friend, you could always count on him.

Again his marriage ended and in 1997 he married Norna Reeves. At that time he was working as a salesman for a company and doing a ton of traveling. They were married until his passing and in that time he was back in the woods off and on, started driving truck for TrueValue which he retired from. He also drove dozers fighting wild fires and helped his son with his towing company. Also in that time he ran for County Commissioner as well, still working on making a difference in the County he loved so much.

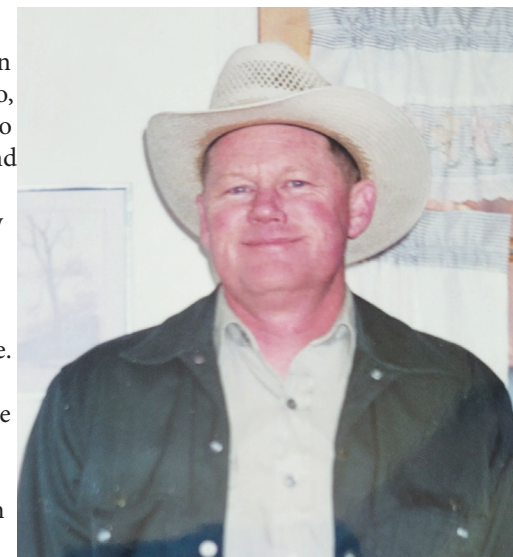
Pete's love and belief in God was a huge part of his life from childhood and he tried to show love like Jesus did to all the people who he came in contact with. Whether it was someone walking down the street or standing in line at Disney Land, a hitch hiker looking for a ride or a child that asked if he was a real cowboy. He always had a smile on his face and excitement in his voice as he talked. He was one of the last true gentlemen who always took his hat off in front of a lady and told them how beautiful they were. He would always joke about hanging out with all the in-laws, ex-laws and outlaws, he loved them all and we have so many fond memories of campouts, vacations, parties, and just daily life with his larger than life attitude! He will be truly missed by all who had the chance to meet him.

He grew up in Grangeville, ID, where hunting and fishing were a huge part of his life. He started his 36-year career with the U.S. Forest Service shortly after going to a trade school in Denver, CO after high school.



He married Marilyn Kinzer around 1968 and they had two children: Chad James and Stacey Lynn McMillin. While in Grangeville, Jim was a member of the Grangeville Trapshooting Club and eventual president. In 1977, he and Marilyn went their separate ways and Jim moved to Oregon, transferring to an Engineering job in Ukiah with the Umatilla National Forest. While on a detail in the Supervisor's Office in Pendleton, he met his future wife, Connie (Emert) McMillin. They moved to Prineville for another job with the Ochoco National Forest. They spent the next nearly 47 years in Prineville and raised a son, Casey Jay McMillin.

Jim loved every minute of being in the woods. That was his happy place. He located the Round Mtn Trail and many other roads and trails. He later became Land and Minerals program staff at the Ochoco National Forest. Jim always did his absolute best to do justice to each position he held. While working with the Forest Service, Jim spent several years volunteering as a member of the Prineville City Commission, a job he also took very seriously. In 1988, he purchased a 5-acre farm and added farming to his life. He grew grass hay and raised a few cows. After retiring from the Ochoco National Forest, Jim enjoyed retirement for four years and then took a job doing all the maintenance for the Ochoco Village Assisted Living for four years before retiring again.

He is survived by his wife Connie; daughter Stacey of Nampa, ID; son Casey of Albany, OR; sister Judi Williams of Boise, ID; brother CJ McMillin of Phoenix, AZ; niece Dani Hardy of Boise, ID; three grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his father, Ralph; mother Sharlene; and son Chad.

Jim led a quiet life and he had a heart of gold, always helping others and living his best life. He will be sorely missed by those who knew him.

Remember When The Corner Store Meant More.....

He can't recall what he had for breakfast or even why he started up the stairs, but when it comes to stories about George's Corner Candy Store, my pops remembers them all.

In the late 1930s, he and his friends would gather in the store at the corner of South Street and Maple Road in their old hometown. On any given night, there would be 10 to 15 of them, most were in their late teens, just hanging out. George, who had emigrated from Germany a few years before, lived upstairs.

The refrigerator always had soda in it, and the honor system meant that if you drank one, you replace it. A bulletin board with everyone's name hung behind the counter, marking the IOU's. No one even thought about cheating George. He was like a father to all of them.

Saturday nights at George's were especially busy. If you didn't have a date, you would head to the store for some cards and conversation. Sometimes the boys with dates felt like they were the ones missing out. More than 40 guys would come through the store, and George knew them all by name and made sure to have their favorite smokes on the counter before they even had to ask.

When World War II erupted, the gang slowly dispersed. Some were drafted, others enlisted, look for adventure. One by one, the boys, who had rarely left the neighborhood, were sent far from the street corn and the familiar faces of friends, family and George.

During the war, George's store was the hub for news about the neighborhood boys. The bulletin board now displayed photos and notes. Every Sunday, after closing the store, George would go upstairs and write to each of the boys with news of the neighborhood. As each wrote back, George shared the news with the others. Pat was in North Africa; Duke was in France. Harry, a Navy flier stationed in Brooklyn, bragged that he'd received overseas pay for flying 13 miles out to sea. George answered all their letters until, finally, the men started to return home. Some, however, never did.

George's was hopping again for a time after the war as

the men sought work and the company of one another. They shared war stories that changed with each retelling until the line between truth and fiction blurred.

Eventually, it was time for the men to marry, and one by one, they held their bachelor parties at George's.

Nights at George's were mostly a thing of the past, but one Christmas Eve in the late 1940s, the men hatched a plan to buy George a television. They all chipped in for a 12-inch black-and-white model. Jack, one of the regulars who had been trained in electronics during the war, set up the antenna. George, preoccupied with getting the store closed up, didn't notice them going up and down the stairs to his apartment.

As George climbed upstairs, the men could barely control their excitement. He opened the door to the sounds of the new television and smiles from the boys he had watched grow into find young men.

Just For Fun

There's a story behind every item in your medicine cabinet. Here's a few!

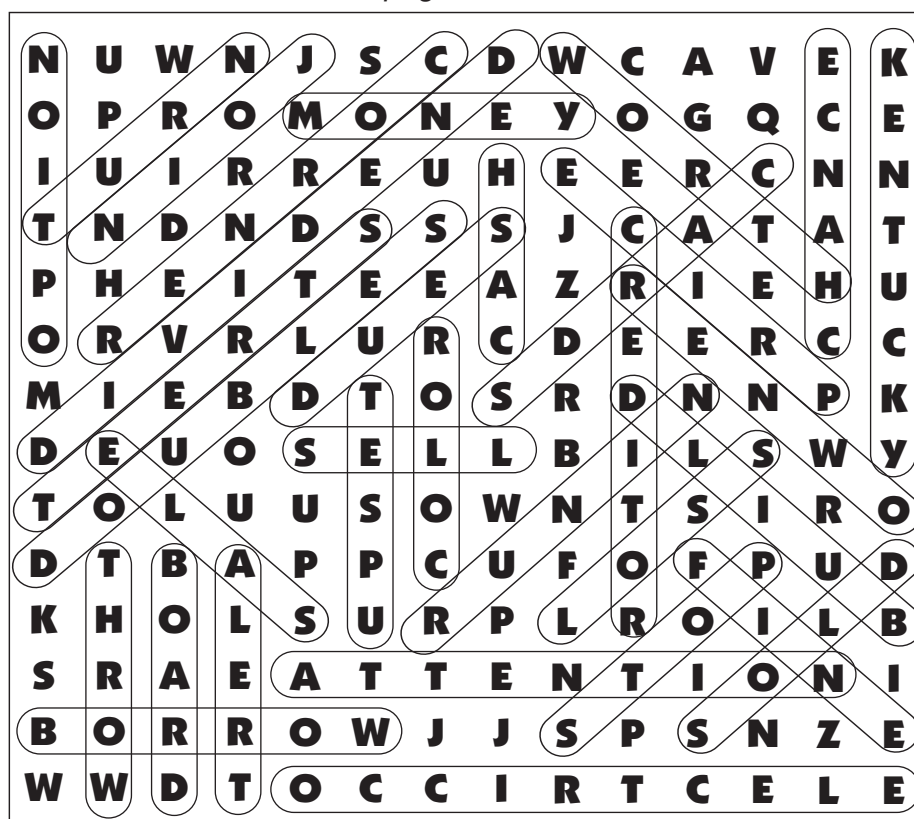

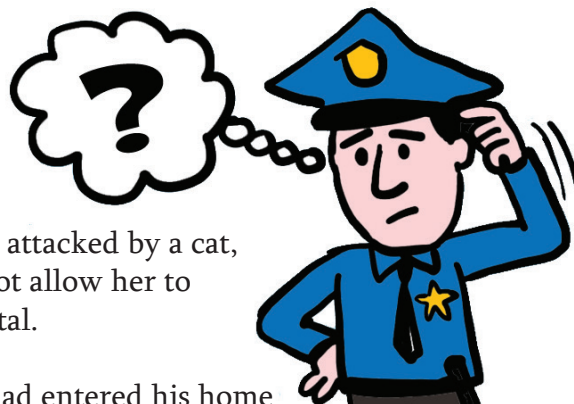

Many an early doctor dissected only one cadaver during this career. Naturally, he prized the skeleton highly and didn't want to dispose of it. Yet public opinion warned against keeping it where it might be seen. So the prudent anatomist hung his prize in a dark corner where visitors were not likely to discover it.

Patients weren't complete numbskulls, however. Most knew or suspected that their physician had a skeleton in his closet. From this literal sense, the phrase expanded to indicate hidden evidence of any kind.

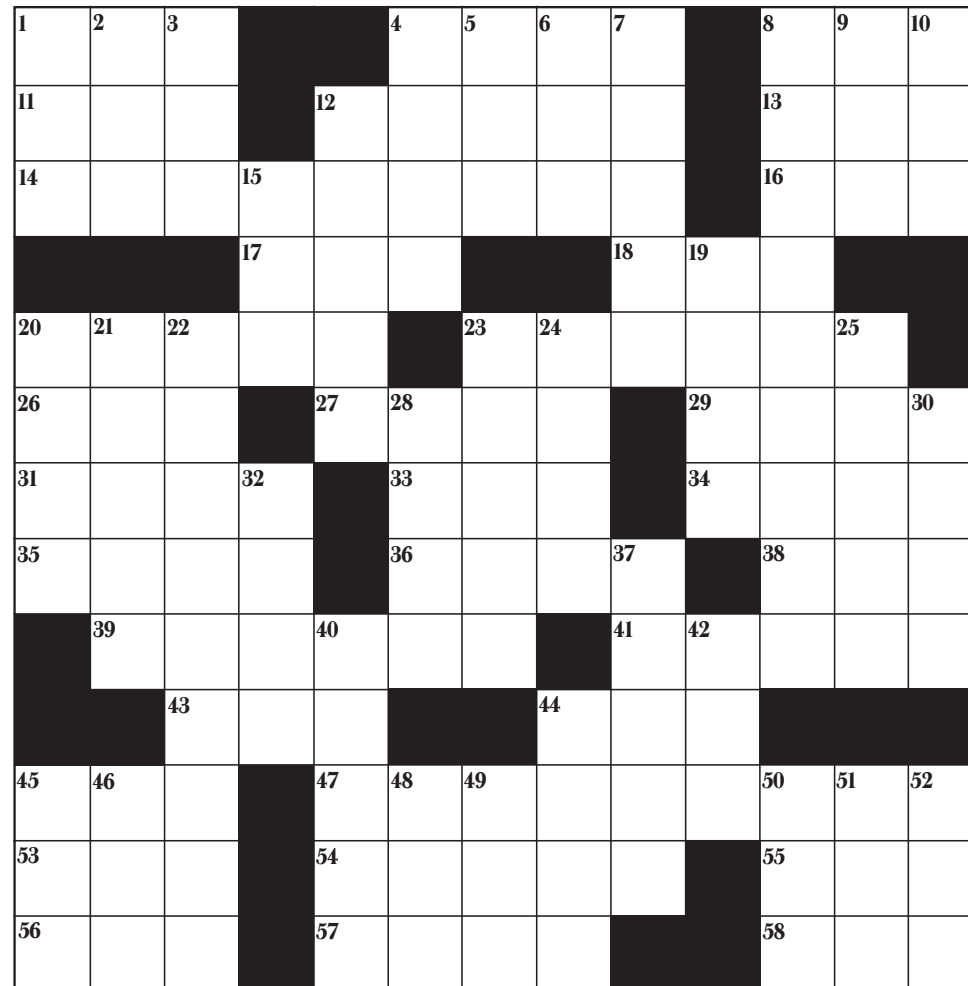
